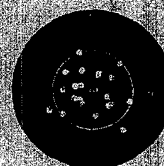

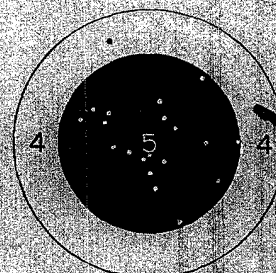

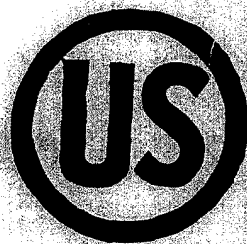
Composite of Twenty Shots by Edgar Strain at 100 Yards
