Gentlemen:-

DRY COLORS:

We acknowledge receipt of your private letter of Aug. 30th and note your request to rush shipment of all orders on hand for dry colors, as you are greatly in need of same.

As you know, the bulk of these orders have been placed with Lavanburg & Co. We are and have been constantly urging them to hurry shipments, as you are in urgent need of the goods. As we understand it, they are having considerable trouble with labor, which accounts for the unusual delay.

They assure us they are doing all they possibly can to get our goods ready, and promise to send us samples for approval within the next few days of Greens and Yellows. If these samples prove satisfactory, goods will go forward in carload next week.

We have just received a satisfactory sample representing 2500 lbs. of #43 Green from A.B. Ansbacher & Co. They expect to have an additional quantity of this color as well as the Chinese Blue on order, ready in time for carload.

#92 YELLOW:

We acknowledge receipt of your night message of the 4th inst., ordering 2 1/2 tons of Lavanburg's #92 Yellow, for rush shipment.
