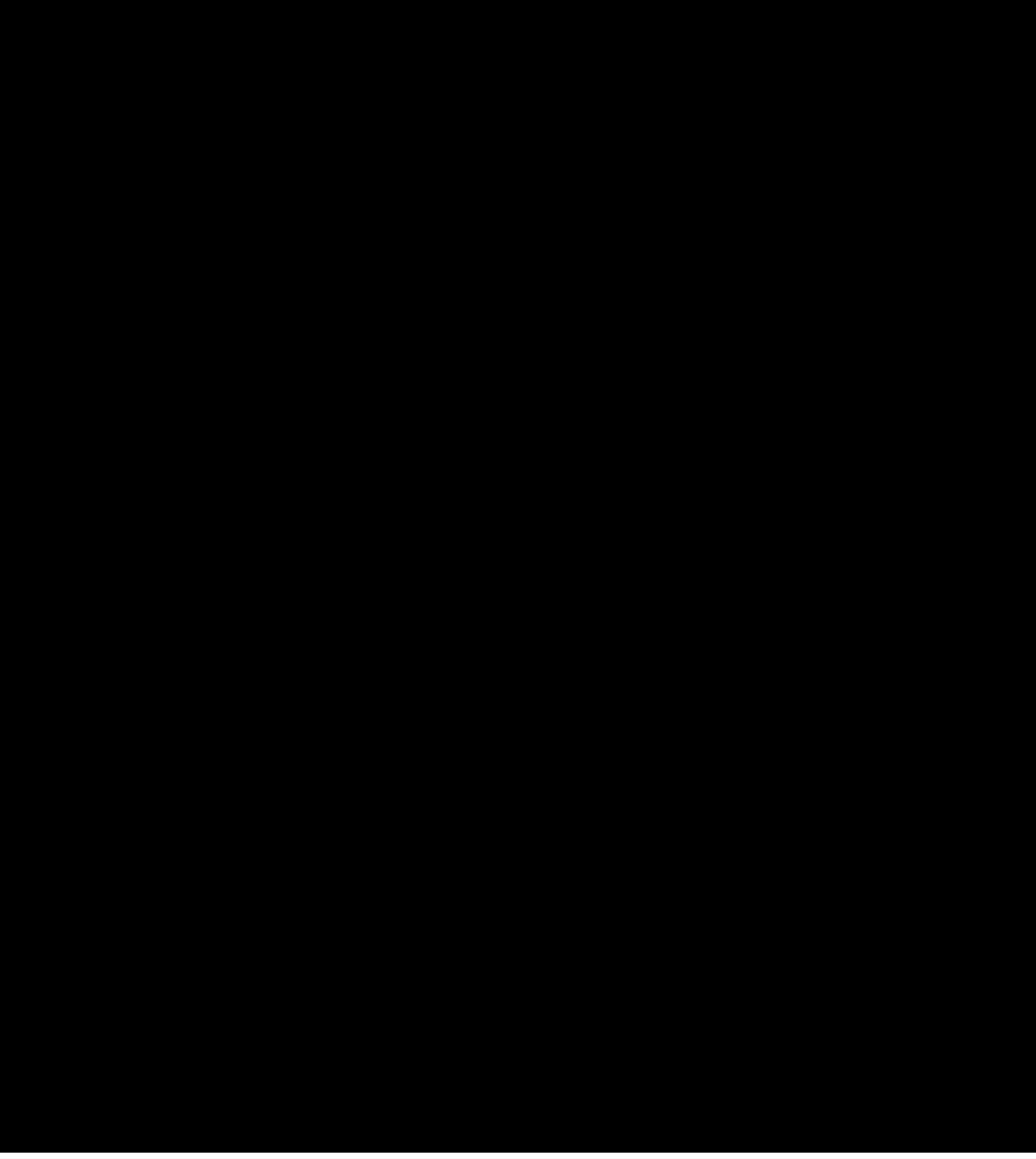

Simple Specifications for Refinishing Old Work

VARNISH in bad condition must be thoroughly removed with a first class remover such as Ad-el-ite. Varnish in good condition should be rubbed down and thoroughly cleansed to remove all foreign matter. Great care must be taken that sandpaper dust is removed.

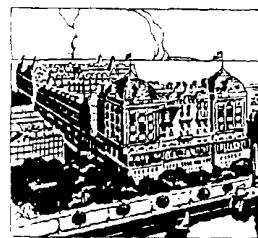
Coat No. 1—Ripolin Enamel undercoat reenforced with one pint of Gloss Ripolin to the gallon.

Coat No. 2—Same as Coat No. 1.

Coat No. 3—A flowing coat of Ripolin which can be thinned by adding a half pint of pure spirits of turpentine to the gallon.

Coat No. 4—A flowing coat of Ripolin as it comes from the can. Do not thin this finishing coat of Ripolin.

FOR years the European demand for Enamel has been steadily growing away from white. Delicate tints, even more pronounced colors have gained increasing popularity.

It follows naturally that the same trend is developing in America.

Selection of the Ripolin tints is made from some sixty colors regularly manufactured in the European factories. Due care has been taken to choose tints which will be beautiful alone and will also harmonize well with white, or each other.

The Charm of Enamel in colors is easily seen when careful study of these soft unflaring tones is made. Any of the seven tints may be lightened by mixing with White Ripolin—or the Ivory (No. 53) may be added to either No. 10 or No. 47 Light Gray, or No. 44 Sea Green, to produce a great variety of pleasing effects.

To obtain a "Colonial" effect try white on the woodwork and Cream (No. 2) Ripolin on the walls. And just consider the possibilities of No. 65 Pink and No. 47 Light Gray.
