Contract Let For Hospital

SALINAS, May 22.—Designed to provide 34 additional beds in the El Sausal tuberculosis sanatorium, the Monterey county board of supervisors Monday afternoon approved a contract with the R. W. Brown Construction company of Madera for a \$68,717 addition at the county hospital.

Except for the addition of a detention room to be used for the confinement of insane persons, and two additional rooms in the general hospital for the keeping of records and storage, all of the construction will be on the sanatorium to relieve the present overcrowding. There are 36 beds in the sanatorium at the present time, with between 10 to 15 tubercular patients being kept in the general hospital. In addition, there is a waiting list of about 50 persons in the tubercular division.

Six estimates considered ranged from \$87,500 to \$99,900 for the work. Since \$45,000 has been allocated for the project considerable paring will be necessary in the 17 alternate plans offered.

Architect Robert Stanton, Dr. John C. Sharp, hospital director, and County Surveyor Howard Cozzens will study the bids and report to the board.

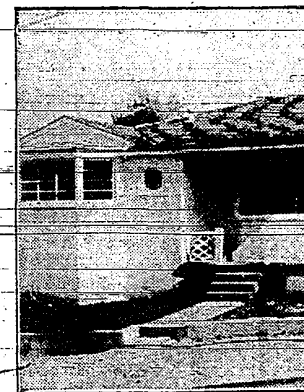
feeding roots spread out. Planting distances vary from eight inches to two feet, according to size of rhizome.

Where the summers are hot, cover the rhizomes with about half an inch of soil. The rhizomes of plantings in cool coastal areas should be left half exposed above the earth. The roots should be well covered and the soil firmed about them. Watering at planting time to settle the soil, and once every week or two during the summer and fall months, will satisfy the moisture requirements of this type of iris.

Established plantings from previous years may be left all summer without water, but better flowers and greater increase will follow an occasional soaking through the summer. Regular watering is very important during the spring months and flowering season.

Iris clumps should be divided only when they become crowded. Crowding shades the rhizomes and causes production of foliage at expense of flowers. They will flower satisfactorily for three or four years when left undisturbed. The clumps may be thinned by dig-
