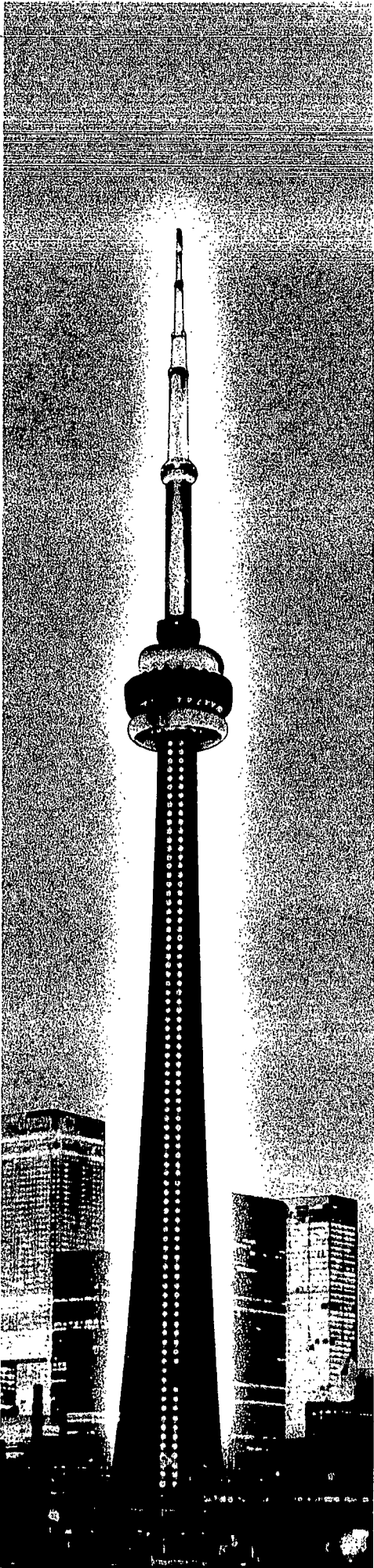


START PACKING FOR THE NAPA WORLD'S FAIR!

The past issue of OUTLOOK presented ideas of things to see and do during your stay in Toronto. But that was only the beginning; there are still more attractions just waiting to be explored . . .

ONTARIO SCIENCE CENTRE: Everything is impressive about this \$25 million complex. The setting: a

beautiful ravine. The architecture: futuristic, clean, startling. The interior: *fascinating*.

All things pertaining to the world of scientific knowledge are presented in an entertaining manner that absolutely invites involvement — quite in keeping, of course, with the Centre's slogan: "Please Touch." With working models, computers, lectures, demonstrations and film shows, the Ontario Science Centre is a difficult place to leave.

METRO TORONTO ZOO: With 700 acres of landscaped parkland divided into five "geographic" zones, the Metro Toronto Zoo represents an exciting new concept in zoo planning. No cramped cages or concrete walkways here; animals roam free (well, almost free!) in their natural habitats.

For the faint of heart (after all, 700 acres is a lot of territory to cover!) there's the Canadian Domain Ride. This silent, smooth running train travels around the beautiful Rouge River Valley section of the park, often at treetop level.

CN TOWER: The world's tallest freestanding structure at 1,815'5", the CN Tower features both indoor and outdoor observation decks, a revolving restaurant at its summit and a family fun arcade at its base. Try riding one of the glass-fronted elevators all the way to the top of the tower for a real heart-stopping experience!

GREAT TORONTO ADVENTURE: The city's newest attraction — a fantastic eight-screen, multi-sensory presentation that takes you through the history, the sights, the sounds and the excitement of Toronto. This hour-long adventure takes place in the Adventure Theatre in the Colonnade (131 Bloor Street West).
