PETALUMA, April 4.—Efforts were continued today to recover the body of J. Ray Corliss of Petaluma, president of the Central California Poultrymen's Association, who was drowned in the ocean at Wright's Beach, 40 miles from here, while fishing Friday. Corliss was washed from a rock by the surf and disappeared despite efforts of his companions, Percy and Arthur White, to save him.

Corliss was one of the best known poultrymen in the United States and a contributor to leading farm magazines. He owned a large farm here.

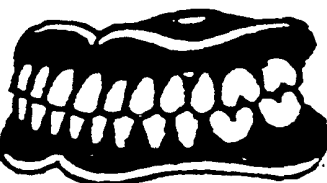
Mayor today issued the following statement:
