MEMORANDUM TO MR. WEBB

Dear Mr. Webb:

In accordance with your request, I have telephoned Dr. Sayers of the Public Health Service this morning concerning the interpretation of the words "a distinctive color" in Surgeon General Cumming's letter of February 18th. Dr. Sayers informs me that he and the Surgeon General interpret this as meaning any distinctive color; that is, the gasoline does not have to be one distinctive color but may be different colors for different companies.
