David Bernhardt, the 53rd Secretary of the U.S. Department of the Interior, will be the lunch keynote speaker at The Heartland Institute's [13th International Conference on Climate Change](#) (ICCC-13) on July 25, 2019 at the Trump International Hotel in Washington, DC.
