He, also, feels that a clarifying statement should be made but does not know just how it can be done, at the moment. Dr. George Wright and Dr. Vorwald expressed some concern about this and felt that the artificial abrasives were inert.

I am anxious to know what conclusions the Council on Occupational Health decided on at the meeting in California, as to how a correction could be properly made without compounding the issue.
