## Lovelight Dim, Glows Again

Cuban Bests Process Server in Suit

One of those tempestuous Latin romances went aground in one of those marital tempests yesterday but not for long.

In mid-afternoon, Mrs. Carmen Dolly Fernandez, a 19 year old Cuban beauty of 2425 Buchanan Street, filed suit for separate maintenance against Raul H. Fernandez, reputed scion of a Cuban sugar dynasty.

**ASKS SUPPORT.**

She asked \$2,500 monthly for her support pending trial of the case, charged extreme cruelty without any detailed allegations, and stated in her complaint that Fernandez has \$1,000,000 in bank deposits alone in San Francisco, New York and Florida.

Then, through Attorney Clyde Dalton, she obtained a temporary restraining order prohibiting Fernandez from disposing of \$250,000 supposedly in a San Francisco bank.

**DENIES RIFT.**

Fernandez took over at that point. First, he denied there was any rift and offered to prove it. While a process server waited outside to prevent him a summons and a copy of his wife's complaint, he engineered a whirlwind reconciliation.

Before dusk last night, Attorney Dalton announced that his client had instructed him to file a dismissal of the separate maintenance action this morning.

The reconciled couple were married at Havana on April 10 last year.

## San Diego Bakery Strike Continues

SAN DIEGO May 11.—(AP)—Hope for a quick settlement of the bakery work stoppage here dwindled today as negotiations were broken off after two hours of futile efforts to settle the labor dispute. No date for future meetings was scheduled.

The work stoppage was in its third day. There was no bread in any of the independent food markets and the shelves of the chain stores were emptied early. Union bakers reverted from their last offer to settle for a twelve cent an hour pay raise back to their position as of last Sunday sixteen cents. The employers have offered four cents.
