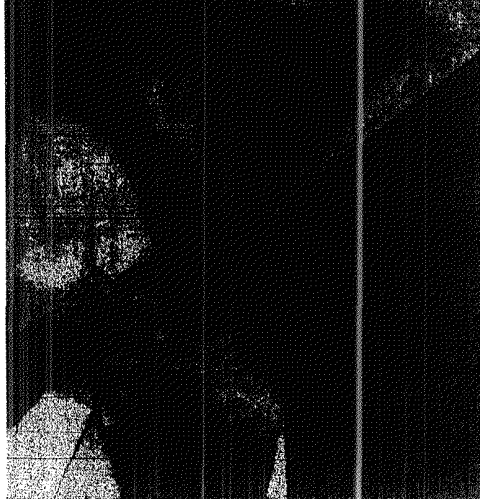
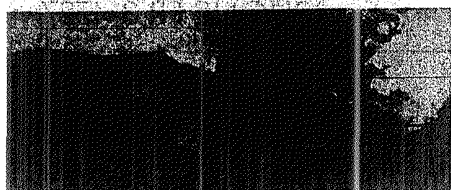

It Was a Wild One . . . Speaking of old newspaper I have a copy of the July 1924 Peninsula Daily Her. The lead story is wonder

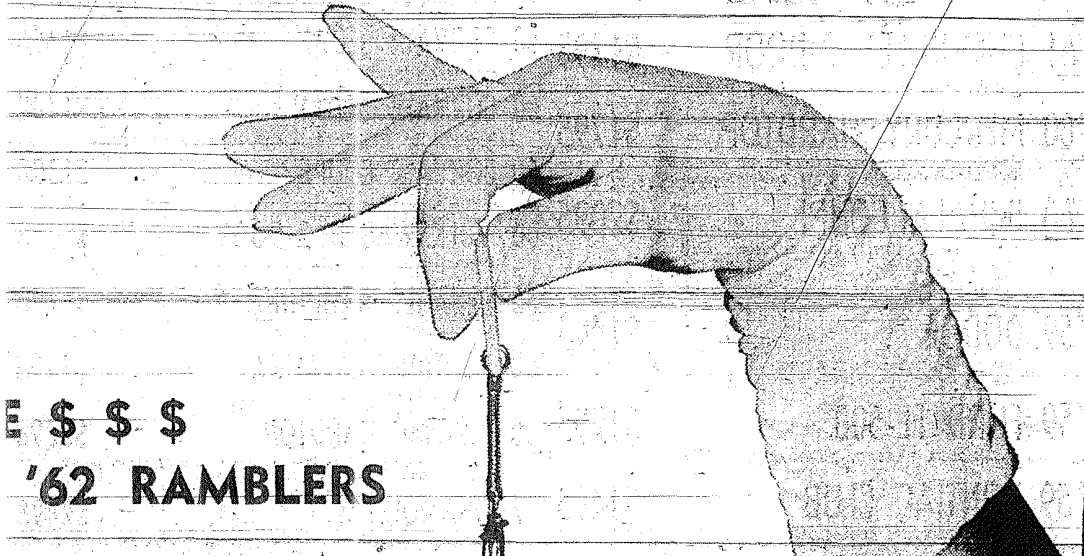
