Dr. Marvin Legator is a PHD Director of Environmental Toxicology in the Department of Preventive Medicine and Community Health at UTMB. *Legator*

Our records on medical surveillance for lead exposure show that urine samples were sent to the Industrial Hygiene lab in the Department of Preventative medicine and Public Health at UTMB for analysis. This was done between November 28, 1951 and December 20, 1955. The reports were signed by Jack Neal the director of the laboratory. It is possible that Marvin Legator could have been working in the lab at the time.

I have no personal recollection of any contract work that he may have done. Dr. Roy Joyner or Dr. Carl Dernehl, my predecessors, may have some knowledge relative to this if it is important enough to follow upon.

Dr. Legator was quite vocal to the press and television about five years ago when Texas City was in the limelight during our brain tumor epidemiology studies.
