

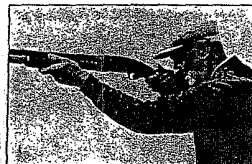
These Champions know Shells

F. C. Vertrees and W. B. Sale, Professional, tied for HIGH in the PRAIRIE DOUBLES, scoring 48 x 50. Vertrees won the shoot-off. Vertrees shot DEFIANCE and Sale CLIMAX shells.
