Dear Mr. Lewis:

I have just had a conversation with Mr. W. P. Glossop of the Standard Oil Company of Kentucky who has just returned from Savannah.

Mr. Glossop assures me that after his arrival in Savannah our regulations governing the cleaning of tanks were adhered to to the best of his knowledge. Mr. Glossop is, of course, desirous of dispelling any impression which we may have had of carelessness in adhering to our regulations, and since my conversation with him, I feel sure that he has only the most sincere intention of imposing the most rigid precautions on men working for him. I am also sure that Mr. Violette has insisted on following our regulations and the affair in Savannah was primarily due to a local ignorance or misunderstanding of our regulations.

We now are assured that tank cleaning procedures will be carefully watched. I anticipate no further difficulties.
