The bunch-flowered Poetaz, the Jonquil and the fragrant double daffodils also are right at home in border groupings and in spot plantings beside the garden terrace bench or gate.

Bulbs are spaced six to eight inches apart in planting pockets dug at least 6 1/2 inches deep. A handful of bone meal dried manure or liquid fish fertilizer is worked into each square foot of soil beneath the bulbs, and they are seated on a thin layer of sand or soil free of plant food.

Select "permanent" planting spots if possible for the bulbs can remain in the same place for about five years.

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Army has estimated that enemy casualties in Korea were 1,373,229 through October 10. The figure is an increase of 26,506 over an estimate announced eight days ago.

U. S. battle losses through October 12 were announced earlier this week as 90,935.

## Construction for California Water Projects Slated

AMARILLO Tex. (AP)—The U. S. Bureau of Reclamation has announced details of a \$48,010,568 construction program for California this fiscal year.

It is part of a \$242,998,667 project to bring water to 507,300 more acres in the West. California, Washington and Colorado will benefit from the projects, some of them started more than a decade ago. They will increase reclamation bureau electric power output by 332,700 kilowatts.

Michael W. Straus, reclamation commissioner, said the government thus will complete 50 years of water resources development work next June with irrigation of more than six million acres of once-arid land and with a hydroelectric power capacity of more than four million kilowatts.

California reclamation projects for the current fiscal year as outlined by Straus include extension of distribution systems in the States Central Valley project, to supply water to an additional 45,000 acres. The big job on this project was the completion of the Tracy pumping plant last August.
