PRINGLE HAS MET WITH BRITISH PETROLEUM WHO HAVE ALSO DUMPED WASTE AT MAENDY QUARRY. HE IS DUE TO TALK TO WASTE DISPOSAL CONTRACTORS PURLE TODAY AND WILL UNDOUBTEDLY CONTACTING BRITISH DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT WHICH CARRIED OUT INDEPENDENT ANALYSIS OF WASTE SAMPLES FROM QUARRY. OF ENVIRONMENT. POSSIBLY PRINGLE STORY WILL APPEAR THIS SUNDAY BUT NOT DEFINITE. WE BELIEVE HIS STORY WILL TAKE THE LINE THAT CHEMICAL WASTE DUMPING CONTROLS NEED TIGHTENING AND THAT NO SINGLE AUTHORITY IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ENSURING SAFE DUMPING.
