- Maintaining a long-view on Gulf restoration
 - Just as there needs to be a cohesive story within any one FPL, we need to consider the consistent thread between FPL 3 and subsequent FPLs
 - What thoughts do you have at this time regarding long-term “success” and how would you be able to articulate that success? This could be success for a watershed or restoration type, or for Bucket 2 funding writ large.
 - How could success be demonstrated qualitatively and/or quantitatively?
 - What may be your “so what” message 5, 10 15 years from now?
 - Path to FPL 3 Priorities; some topics may include:
 - What/where:
 - Existing regional plans and/or plans under development that you will be drawing upon in the development of FPL 3 proposals
 - Known watershed and/or restoration type priorities that you may be focusing your collaboration efforts on
 - Why:
 - Goals and objectives of any watershed and/or restoration type that you may be seeking to support with FPL funds
 - 1 or 2 potential long-term outcomes and indicators of success that you foresee from your efforts
 - Any “Gulfwide” ideas that you may propose
