Dear Doctor Kehoe:

I wish to thank you for your letter of September 19, and have asked Mr. [REDACTED] to collect samples as you instructed. I understand he has forwarded these to you for examination.

Regarding the recurrence of symptoms of this patient I would say they were very sudden, about two months after he began to handle Ethyl Gasoline, marked by extreme asthenia, blurring of vision and a tendency to stagger to the left side. These were present about a week and then gradually disappeared during the next three weeks after he was taken away from Ethyl Gasoline. The only medication he received was Sulphur Diasporal intravenously every other day and Potassium Iodide saturated solution 10 min. T.I.D.

At present he is feeling well again and has gone back to work. Have nothing further to add regarding this patient and am interested to know whether you have found any evidence of lead poisoning in the examination of the stool and urine. I will write you if I note any changes in his symptoms in the future. Thanking you, I am,
