Gentlemen:

I refer you to my report on Mr. Ridley Boudreaux, as Thomas Davis sustained similar exposure to heated fumes of Therminol FR-O, at the same time and essentially same degree as Mr. Boudreaux. The accident occurred at the same time and place.

When seen in my office the patient's only complaint was a headache. This office examination took place February 1, 1966.

Examination revealed a blood pressure of 170/100 with a pulse rate of 80. There was no respiratory distress and lung fields were clear on examination. X-ray examination of the lungs was unremarkable. The skin of hands and arms was somewhat dry, but was not cracked and there was no evidence of infection.

He was seen again on February 2nd and 8, 1966. Examination was essentially unremarkable except for continued elevated blood pressure of 170/100. This was not thought to be related to his exposure to the Therminol FR-O and he was advised to see his own private physician concerning this. I could find no evidence of damage as result of exposure to vapors of Therminol FR-O.

He was discharged from further medical care, and advised to continue working in his usual occupation.
