



OWENS-CORNING FIBERGLAS BUYS
KAYLO DIVISION OF OWENS-ILLINOIS

TOLEDO, O., May 12; Owens-Corning Fiberglas Corporation has purchased the Kaylo Division of Owens-Illinois Glass Company, Harold Boeschstein, Fiberglas president, announced today.

The acquisition includes the manufacturing plant at Berlin, N. J., where Kaylo, an industrial heat insulation product effective up to 1,800 degrees fahrenheit, is produced.

Kaylo block and pipe products have been distributed nationally since April, 1953 by Owens-Corning to supplement its own line of Fiberglas industrial insulations. Kaylo insulations were introduced by Owens-Illinois in 1943 and since then have attained wide acceptance in a variety of applications.

Kaylo insulation products are used majorly in the power, chemical refining and other process industries for such equipment as autoclaves, boilers, breechings, chilling pits, condensers, dryers, evaporators, furnaces, heat exchangers, hot air ducts, kilns, glass annealing furnaces, locomotives, precipitators, process systems, steam lines, tanks, towers, turbines and vessels.

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
