

A Record Target



THE target shown above was shot by Sr. Agustin de Elia Victorica of Argentina using U. S. .22 N. R. A.'s in a competition of "Maestro Tirador de Pistola" (Pistol Shooting). The following, referring to the event, is an excerpt from "La Prensa" of Buenos Aires.

"Señor Agustin de Elia Victorica of the Tiro Federal de Parana, taking part in the competition of "Maestro Tirador de Pistola", hit the bull's-eye 60 times out of 60 shots at fifty meters. This record has never been obtained previously in an official demonstration. It beats the performance of Petit René of France, who in the 1924 Olympics made 59 bull's-eyes out of a possible 60." (Petit René also used U. S. N. R. A.'s.)

Another Fine Record

From Cristobal, Canal Zone, comes another report of some exceptional shooting. In a match at the Cristobal Gun Club, L. C. Leighton, using U. S. .38 S. & W. Special cartridges, made a total of 198 x 100. He dropped a point at 15 yards and at 25 yards, but shot a possible 50 at yards and also on the moving target.

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
