10 Million Cited as Chest Goal

Needs for the coming Los Angeles Community Chest drive are well over the \$10,000,000 goal announced yesterday, Campaign Chairman Walter W. Candy Jr., said at an organizational luncheon at the Biltmore.

About 150 volunteer presidents of agencies affiliated with the Community Chest heard Candy, who is president of Bullock's, Inc., describe the Chest's needs as \$500,000 more than they were a year ago.

Day on Campus

Dr. Woods spent Thursday on the Los Angeles campus returning home that evening. He died during the night. He leaves two sons, Baldwin of Hollywood and Ronald Berkeley and his widow, Reside of Berkeley.

Dr. Woods was appointed director of UC Extension in 1901, after a distinguished career as an engineer and professor of engineering. He went to Berkeley in 1908. He was graduated from the University of Texas and received advance degrees from the University of California, the University of Paris and the University of Munich in Germany.

Dean Woods' long association with UC includes many activities on the two major campuses. During the summers of 1921-23, he was dean of the summer sessions on the Los Angeles campus.

Head of Air Board

During World War I, he was president of the academy board of the U.S. School of Military Aeronautics, Berkeley, where some 4000 aviation cadets received ground school training. For a number of years thereafter, the principal instruction in aerodynamics at the university was given by him, and many aeronautical engineers of the present day can trace their beginnings in the profession to him.

During recent years, Dr. Woods served as consultant to the National Resources Planning Board of the Federal government. He served one year as president of the American Society of Plan-

neers and a member of the American Society of Heating and Ventilating Engineers.

On Defense Council

In World War II, Dr. Woods was a member of the California State Council of Defense and chairman of its committee on transportation, housing, works and facilities.
