1. With the assistance of Dr. W. Hartfiel, I hope to be in a position in the near future to establish a hearing testing and sight-screening program at your location. (Approximate cost for equipment is \$3,500.00)
 2. Arc welders and grinders should have annual x-rays in accord with Dr. Hartfiel's medical program. OK
 3. Employees exposed to lead content paint and sprays should have annual blood test taken by the plant selected physician and sent to Dr. Robert A. Kehoe, University of Cincinnati, Kettering Laboratory, College of Medicine, Eden and Bethesda, Cincinnati, Ohio 45219.
 4. All supervisors should receive First Aid Training. This is particularly important since you are planning to go to a second shift in the near future.

As I explained, a new bulletin system is being prepared to explain the new Occupational Safety and Health (OSHA) Act. Necessary reporting forms will be prepared by us and sent to you.
