Dear Larry:

Per your request during our discussion last week, I am sending information regarding treatment of irritated eyes after exposure to Hydraul 312 spray.

First, have the man effected flush out his eye with water continuously for fifteen minutes. Then apply Pontocaine ophthalmic solution. Pontocaine is a local anesthetic which your medical department can obtain by prescription. It is suggested that you have the Pontocaine available near the die casting department.

If further treatment is desired or needed, you should have a doctor apply an ophthalmic solution of cortisone.
