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2. San Mateo city govern-
ment, in hopes the state would
soon buy land adjacent to the

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3. San Mateo spends more
than \$17,000 a year to police
Bayshore Highway in the city

trol cannot handle the job. That
is a job paid for by the city,
Raymond said, that should be
paid by the state.

4. Local hospitals are over-
taxed with automobile accident
cases resulting from congestion
on the highway at Third Avenue
and because of that, construc-
tion of a new hospital (Penin-
sula District) to handle normal
cases to be hospitalized has been
made necessary. Another ex-
ample, McDonnell said, of local
residents being made to foot the
bill on a charge that should not
legitimately be laid against
them.

'We're willing to be reason-
able,' Raymond said, in his plea
for additional bond allocations
for the county, but we won't
accept crumbs.'

The addition of two lanes
from South San Francisco
north to Geneva Ave could be
a "godsend," he added, but
the general impression is that
when we accept those two
lanes that it represents crumbs
to appease us.

'We want everything that's
coming to us.'

Raymond charged that the
scheduled allocation of funds
made four years ago under the
Burns-Collier Bill (which gave
San Mateo County a minimum
expenditure of slightly more
than two million dollars for a
five-year period) has become
almost obsolete now in view
of the tremendous population
growth on the Peninsula.

'We have to plan for the fu-
ture,' he said.

GIs should get started on summer school plans

WASHINGTON, May 5.—
Veterans who want to go to
summer school under the GI Bill
should start making the ar-
rangements now, the Veterans
Administration said today.

The agency said in a state-
ment that veterans should first
find out whether their VA cer-
tificates of eligibility are in
order. Those planning to change
their courses should learn from
VA whether they must undergo
advisement and guidance.

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
