PROGRAM ESTABLISHED TO MATCH EMPLOYEE GIFTS TO COLLEGES

As a means of contributing to the progress and strength of the nation's educational system, a program for matching employee gifts to colleges has been established by The National Lead Foundation, Inc. Under this program the Foundation will duplicate gifts made by employees of National Lead Company or its wholly owned domestic subsidiaries to approved colleges and universities of their choice. In any calendar year the Foundation's contribution with respect to the gifts of any individual employee shall be limited to the sum of \$500.
