Dear Chairman Barrasso and Ranking Member Carper:

We are writing on behalf of millions of businesses, large and small, to urge you to move as quickly as possible to advance the four nominees currently pending before your Committee for Assistant Administrators of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Our organizations represent many major sectors of the American economy—including aerospace, agriculture, apparel, automotive, building and construction materials, chemical and raw material production, consumer and industrial goods, distribution, electronics, energy, equipment manufacturers, food and grocery, footwear, healthcare products and medical technology, information technology, mining and metals, paper and wood products, plastics, retail, storage, tire manufacturers, and travel goods.

- Michael Dourson, for EPA Assistant Administrator, Office of Chemical Safety & Pollution Prevention;
- Matthew Leopold, for EPA Assistant Administrator, Office of the General Counsel;
- David Ross, for EPA Assistant Administrator, Office of Water; and
- William Wehrum, for EPA Assistant Administrator, Office of Air & Radiation.

We appreciate your assistance in this important and timely matter.
