compliance with this Agreement shall constitute a full, final and complete  
settlement, accord and satisfaction of any and all claims of the claimant  
herein against the respondents, or any of them, by virtue of the premises, and  
is hereby ratified.

  
COMPENSATION COMMISSIONER

AGREEMENT OF ADJUSTMENT  
AND  
STIPULATION FOR AWARD

A contract of employment was in force between Edward L. Campbell, hereinafter referred to as the claimant, and Insulation Company on or about August, 1953, and prior thereto, the claimant had worked for the various employers set out in the caption hereof.

All of these parties were subject to the provisions of the Compensation Act and the employers herein had complied therewith by insuring their compensation liability with the insurers set out in the caption hereof, except Scovill Manufacturing Company, which was a duly qualified self-insured at the time in question.

Pursuant to due and regular notice, the above entitled case was assigned for a hearing before the Compensation Commissioner for the First Congressional District, acting also for the Commissioners for the Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Districts, who were duly disqualified, on November 7, 1955, on which date a conference was held between the attorney for the claimant and the representatives of the respondents with Commissioner Noonan in order to compromise the entire case.

At this conference, it was the claimant's contention that he had worked for many years for the various employers set out in the caption hereof that, as a result of his employment, he contracted an occupational disease, to wit: asbestosis; that he became disabled therefrom on or about August 19, 1953, and has remained disabled to the present date, is still disabled and will continue to be disabled for an indefinite time in the future; that he has incurred considerable expense for medical and hospital treatment; that he has been rendered totally and permanently incapacitated; and that he will require further medical treatment and hospital care in the future.

Alleging that he had sustained an occupational disease that arose out of and in the course of his employment, the claimant sought compensation for disability, past, present and future, both total and partial, compensation for a permanent condition and payment of all the reasonable medical, surgical, hospital, sanatorium and incidental bills incurred and to be incurred in connection with the treatment of his condition.

The respondents, however, denied that the claimant had sustained any occupational disease that arose out of and in the course of his employment with the employers herein. Each employer maintained that the claimant's employment with it was not a substantial factor in causing or aggravating the claimant's condition. The respondents set forth that the claimant was unable to establish any dates as to his employment with the various employers herein and that he could never maintain his burden of proof as to when and where he worked and for whom. The respondents further contended that the claimant had filed no written claim for compensation within the period of one year from the date of his first manifestations of symptoms of his occupational disease and that, therefore, the claim was outlawed by reason of the statute of limitations. Many of the employers further maintained that the claimant had never filed a claim for compensation within a period of five years after leaving their employment and that the claim was further outlawed for that additional reason. The respondents further denied the extent of the claimant's disability, as alleged. Each respondent denied that its employment had caused or produced any permanent condition, but if so, denied the extent thereof.

However, in view of the number of technical, legal and medical questions that were involved, and in view of the other doubts in the case, as

outlined by the claims of the parties hereto, it is hereby agreed and understood by and between the claimant, the employers and insurers herein, all parties to the controversy, that while their respective claims are made in good faith, the claim is a disputed one and that its results, if fully prosecuted, would be doubtful.

WHEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto that the respondents shall pay to the claimant the sum of Six Thousand (6000) Dollars, the same to be in full, final and complete settlement, adjustment, accord and satisfaction of all claims which the aforesaid claimant might otherwise have against the respondents, or any of them, and to be made and accepted in lieu of all other compensation payments, in accordance with the language of our Act.

It is hereby agreed and understood that said settlement of Six Thousand (6000) Dollars shall be divided and apportioned among the respondents herein as follows, to wit:

The payment of said sum of Six Thousand (6000) Dollars shall be made and accepted as a full and final settlement for all compensation for said occupational disease and for all results upon the claimant, past, present and future, and for all claims for past, present and future medical, surgical, hospital, sanatorium and incidental expenses and all compensation which may

be due to anyone in case of the death of the claimant, to the end that the payment of such sum shall constitute a complete satisfaction of all claims due or to become due at any time in favor of anybody on account of the claimed occupational disease, or on account of any condition in any way resulting out of the said condition, or on account of the death of the claimant on account of said condition.

It is expressly understood and agreed that the payment of said sum of Six Thousand (6000) Dollars is in full accord and satisfaction of a disputed claim and is not an admission of any liability by the respondents, or any of them.

It is further stipulated and agreed that, before the claimant signed this stipulation, he read it, or the same was read and interpreted to him in a language that he understands, and he knows that it is a full and final settlement and that it is intended to deal with any and all conditions, known or unknown which exist as of the date hereof, or any changes of conditions which may arise in the future on account of said occupational disease.

It is further agreed by and between the parties that this stipulation was not induced or entered into by fraud, accident, mistake or duress and that none of the parties hereafter shall have any further claims under the Workmen's Compensation Act of the State of Connecticut.

IN VIEW OF THE FOREGOING, We, the undersigned, hereby unite in requesting that the Compensation Commissioner for the First Congressional District, also acting for the Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Districts, make an Award by Stipulation pursuant to this Agreement.

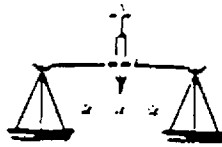

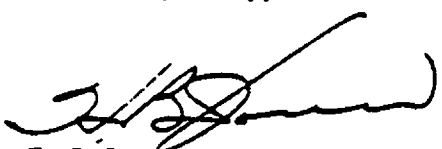
