Dear Dr. Kehoe:

According to our short meeting in New York at the
A. P. H. A. meeting you were kind enough to allow us
to write you for advice.

The present stage of my lead program consists of
only blood leads with no urinary lead determinations at
all. I would be very grateful if you would send me
information concerning the type of container, precautions
of sampling and interpretations of results. I presume
the container should be pyrex, as are our tubes for blood
samples.

As you know, we offer not only a diagnostic service
to small plants, but a laboratory service to the plant
physician or physician on call. For economy, we send
them simple petroff needles with pyrex oxalated tubes.
We would like to include urine determinations for them
as well.

We would appreciate your sending us any available
reprints of the work of your laboratory. As soon as the
various kinks are worked out, I would like to send you
our state program in lead for your approval.

Thank you for your kind consideration of these
problems.
