Enclosed please find our invoice for reimbursable expenses and technical support to CTFA during November 2000. As we discussed on the telephone, with the added tasks we were asked to perform, the amount of this invoice is higher than that budgeted for the project as outlined in my letter dated October 20, 2000. The initial assignment from you specified three tasks:

- 1) Retrieve literature on non-asbestiform talc and ovarian cancer;
- 2) Summarize each of the available studies in a format usable by experts; and
- 3) Retain two experts to review the literature provided by us, prepare testimony, and present this testimony at the Board of Scientific Counselors' meeting in December.

Our initial task was to retain two well-qualified, renowned epidemiologists who would work independently and present at the meeting. However, no expert we contacted could fulfill the assignment as initially conceived because of the quick turnaround required. With your verbal agreement, we retained a group of pre-eminent epidemiologists (Drs. Rothman, Pastides, and Samet) to work in a manner that would minimize each individual's time on the project. In addition, we were able to retain Drs. Shapiro and Muscat to provide individual statements.

Thus, what seemed initially to be a straightforward task turned out to be a much more complex endeavor requiring additional hours of expert time and additional efforts by THE WEINBERG GROUP INC. to recruit and coordinate the team of experts.

Tasks authorized verbally by you after the issuance of October 20, 2000 letter, given the new working scenario presented above, include:

- Retention of three additional epidemiologists. The retention of a total of five epidemiologists (two who worked independently and three who worked as a team) for this project required considerable time and effort on my part beyond what was budgeted. Numerous hours were spent not only in identifying and contacting experts, but also in researching expert qualifications, and in numerous discussions with CTFA. Most importantly, the rate estimated for the experts (\$350) was an underestimate of the amount actually charged; the going rate for such highly reputed epidemiologists for work with such a short turnaround time is \$500 per hour.
- Organization of, preparation for, and coordination of a meeting of the three experts who worked as a team in Boston on November 14, 2000. The costs incurred in this meeting were not budgeted originally, but I believe the meeting was essential to the success of this project. Meeting early in the review process allowed the group to develop a cohesive working style; they discussed the literature, drafted bottom-line conclusions, and developed an effective group strategy. The experts worked productively together, but my coordination and guidance were essential to the successful completion of the final draft of this effort. Costs were minimized by taking advantage of attendance of 2 of these experts at the APHA meeting.
- The five experts required far more support in conducting their analyses and preparing draft statements than was originally anticipated. Additional work was required by THE WEINBERG GROUP to retrieve literature and perform critical reviews of papers. Other WEINBERG GROUP staff were brought on the project to provide expeditious resolution to the experts' questions and meet their needs in a timely manner.

As this project has played out, THE WEINBERG GROUP was instrumental in retaining and managing experts of considerable stature and importance whose opinions supported the Association's position. We were also instrumental in negotiating the participation of the speaker of your choice to represent your interests in the presentation to the Board. This has been a difficult process, but we believe that you will be going into the Board of Scientific Counselors' meeting with the most qualified person to speak on your behalf.

Please be advised that this invoice does not include professional time and effort that is being expended in December to assist Dr. Pastides in preparing his oral presentation. THE WEINBERG GROUP is supporting Dr. Pastides both in the development of the substance of his presentations and in the preparation of Power Point slides. In addition, Dr. Pastides' time to attend the preparatory meeting at CTFA on December 13th and the Board's meeting on the

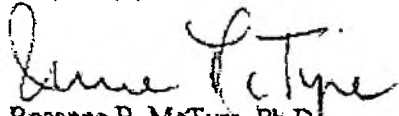

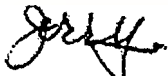

PROJECT PLAN- CTFATALC

Goal: To have two prominent epidemiology experts argue (in front of the NTP Board of Scientific Counselors (December 13-14, 2000) against the allegation that perineal use of non-asbestiform talc is associated with an increased risk of ovarian cancer. NTP has listed this exposure to be considered for classification as a known human carcinogen. All tasks have to be completed by Monday November 20 (4 weeks)

Major Tasks:

1. Perform comprehensive search of the literature (see "Identify relevant literature" in proposal letter 10/20, page 2. This includes tree-searching of articlewews and culling of literature to arrive at the list of epidemiologic papers (analytic) that speak to this issue. (Startg immediately; finished by November 3)
2. Prepare critical reviews (table format or critical abstract) of all relevant papers. (Start immediately; due on November 7; should overlap task 1)
3. Identify 2 prominent epidemiologists or 1 epidemiologist and 1 clinician who are familiar enough with this literature to have a position. To arrive at this number first make a short list of about 4 or 5 potential candidates. (Start immediately; secure experts by November 1)

Specific Assignments:

Task 1. Perform comprehensive search of the literature (kero, juja, gegl)

- Kero to manage effort and select papers for inclusion (12 hours)
- Juja and Gegl to conduct search, order and retrieve papers (20 hours each)
- Romc general oversight and direction (5 hours)

Task 2. Prepare critical reviews (kero, brni, juja)

- Kero to manage effort and set format (10 hours)
- Brni to perform critical reviews according to standard format (60 hours- depending on number of papers)
- Juja to Q/A and standardize reviews (30 hours depending on number of papers)
- Romc general oversight and direction (6 hours)

Task 3. Identify and Retain experts (romc, gegl, brni)

- Gegl to research the composition of the NTP Board of Scientific Counselors and other information readily available about the meeting in December (right away).
- Brni to review readily available materials (internet, existing papers, review papers, etc.) to inform Romc where we stand regarding the data (by October 26)
- Romc to work with Tedu and Mywe to identify and call relevant experts

- Gegl to prepare dossiers on experts (working with Dan Mallon) (as soon as list of 4-5 is secured)
- Rome to call experts and gauge their position; prepare list for CTFA; retain experts
- Gegl to work with experts to get them their materials, etc.

We are pleased to have this opportunity to provide you with a revised proposal in response to your request for experts and analyses of the literature on talc and ovarian cancer. This letter summarizes our understanding of the scope of work, our proposed technical approach, the qualifications and experience of our proposed project team, and our schedule and costs for completing the work.

OUR UNDERSTANDING OF THE SCOPE OF WORK

THE WEINBERG GROUP INC. is aware that the National Toxicology Program (NTP) has proposed non-asbestiform talc for possible listing in its 10th Report on Carcinogens. NTP is taking this action based on some evidence that non-asbestiform talc causes certain cancers in rats, as well as epidemiologic studies that have linked perineal talc exposures with lung and ovarian cancer in women. The CTFA is concerned about such a listing and is interested in an independent review of the literature on non-asbestiform talc and risk of ovarian cancer. In addition, CTFA would like THE WEINBERG GROUP INC. to identify two experts who can address this topic at NTP's Board of Scientific Counselors' Meeting.

TECHNICAL APPROACH

We propose to identify the relevant literature on non-asbestiform talc and ovarian cancer, and to develop experts on this topic through the following tasks:

TASK 1: Retrieve Literature

Identify relevant literature

The goal of this task is to identify all relevant epidemiologic literature (case-control and cohort studies) on non-asbestiform talc and risk of ovarian cancer. We will begin by retrieving all references (there appear to be 17 on non-asbestiform talc and ovarian cancer) cited in the NTP's "Draft Report on Carcinogens, Background Document for Talc, Asbestiform and Non-Asbestiform." However, our previous experience in examining NTP reviews suggests that the NTP often fails to consider relevant literature. Therefore, we propose to conduct a comprehensive search of the readily available English-language literature using proven on-line searching techniques (Dialog, etc.) for additional epidemiologic studies on non-asbestiform talc and ovarian cancer.

We will search only for those papers published after 1980 (when Cramer first reported an association) to ensure that the exposures examined were non-asbestiform talc. We estimate that this search may yield approximately 40 relevant epidemiologic studies (case-control and cohort). In addition, we will search (to the extent possible) for papers that have relevant information, but were not specifically designed to examine the issue of talc and ovarian cancer.

An electronic database of relevant citations will result from THE WEINBERG GROUP's citation ordering and tracking system. We routinely maintain electronic copies of all relevant publications collected in support of a project. The resulting literature maintenance system allows articles to be searched, reproduced, and sorted.

Tree-search each relevant paper

As each relevant paper is identified, its bibliography will be "tree-searched" to identify other relevant studies that may have been missed in the on-line search. Tree-searching involves reading an article's bibliography, and then identifying relevant publications cited therein, based on the title or author. Experience has taught us that this step is often essential to identify all relevant papers.

TASK 2: Summarize Important Elements of Each Paper

Once the relevant epidemiologic studies on non-asbestiform talc and ovarian cancer have been identified, we will summarize them in a manner that will facilitate their review by the experts. We propose a tabular format that we have used successfully in the past that presents details on the citation/authors, study design and population, exposure information, odds ratios/relative risks, and critical comments. Such a format will facilitate review of each paper by the experts, and will enable direct comparisons of similarities and differences among the studies.

TASK 3: Identify and Prepare Experts for Meeting of the NTP Board of Scientific Counselors

Identify experts

We will use our **proven search techniques** to identify two noted epidemiologists who can effectively address the issue of non-asbestosiform talc and ovarian cancer for one day at the meeting of the NTP's Board of Scientific Counselors, scheduled for December 13-14, 2000. THE WEINBERG GROUP INC. has substantial experience in identifying experts with impressive credentials who are qualified to address specific issues. We will begin by researching several renowned epidemiologists who are qualified and able to speak on methodologic issues surrounding this area of literature. We will speak with them to assess their views on and proposed approach to this topic.

With your approval and input, we will proceed to contact and secure the services of two individuals. On this assignment, Ms. Jakum will be responsible for performing the literature search and retrieving relevant articles.
