Sydney - our CEO, Gary Heminger, would be very glad for an opportunity to visit with the Administrator, as there are any number of EPA regulations (including the Renewable Fuel Standard) that impact Marathon Petroleum Corporation and our operations. We appreciate Administrator Pruitt's firm and long-held commitment to cooperative federalism, and I believe this would be a constructive dialogue.

By way of a little background, MPC is the third largest refiner in the U.S., with refining operations in Kentucky, Texas, Ohio, Louisiana, Illinois, and Michigan. We also have (through our 2015 acquisition of MarkWest) natural gas gathering and processing operations in Oklahoma, Texas, and the Marcellus region; and significant retail, maritime, pipeline, and terminal operations across the eastern half of the U.S.

Mr. Heminger is scheduled to be in town June 6, and will also be here June 21 if that date would be better. Please let me know if there is anything in particular I might be able to provide that would be helpful on your end.
