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AROCLORE

It would be a help if St. Louis would send us an up-to-date formal standard specification sheet for each of the Aroclors which might be made at Anniston. At present we have to work with memos and teletypes from various sources which are conflicting or incomplete.

EXAMPLES

Aroclor 4465, regular

Loss at 163°C, specified at .25 to .29, Howerton memo
" " " " no specif. in Wiegand's memo to me, 2-15

Aroclor 4465, regular

Sp. Gr. at 25/25 and 65/65 are specified in Howerton's memo
Wiegand's memo, 2/15 gives no specif. on sp. gr.

Aroclor 1254

Distilling range specifications have been changed, but we have only garbled information, for example - at 50% the specification rec'd requires 377 to 390°C. We think this applies to the 90% reading. We do not know if the aging test on resistivity is still required, or if burn point is recorded.

Aroclor 4065, regular and Halowax

Acid number is specified at 0.32 to 0.42 in Howerton's memo. This obviously refers to typical values and Wiegand's memo shows no limits on this item.

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
