

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION

Young, well built, intelligent and cooperative. Looks perfectly well.

EYES: Equal, regular, react to light and accommodation.

MOUTH: Teeth fairly clean and in good condition. Gums healthy and there is not the slightest evidence of pigmentation.

THROAT: Tonsils deeply imbedded. Pillars inflamed. Pharynx not remarkable.

NOSE: Mucous membrane swollen - muco-purulent exudate both sides (has had head cold for three days).
There is no tenderness of sinuses.

CHEST: Well developed. Percussion note and breath sounds of normal quality.

HEART: Not enlarged - sounds regular, of very good quality, no murmurs.

ABDOMEN: No masses are felt. The liver is not palpable. There is a rather generalized but not acute tenderness over the abdomen, being more marked in both lower quadrants. There is no soreness or tenderness over the back. No rigidity.

L.GLANDS: There is no adenopathy.

C.N. S. : Reflexes all of average activity. Romberg negative. Sensation normal. There is no tremor. There is no weakness of extensors of wrists nor of the brachial group. Strength of hands 140 R and L. Blood Pressure 110/70.

Temperature 98.6. Pulse 76, Haemoglobin 90. Urine: reaction neutral. Albumen neg. Sugar neg.

There are at present no signs of lead poisoning. Examination of blood smear taken on this date shows 10 stippled red cells to 50 fields.
