We have just received a complaint from one of our customers that one of his service station men contracted lead poisoning in his hands through the handling of our Koolmotor gasoline.

In spite of this attention, there does not seem to be any improvement in his condition. It is our opinion that it will be difficult for a man to contract lead poisoning in this manner, but we are calling this matter to your attention to inquire if you are familiar with any similar cases.
