



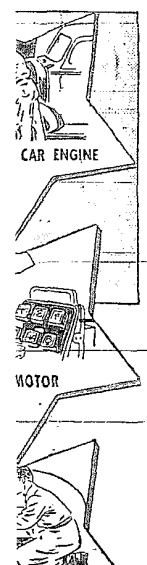

Women Urgently Needed for Work On Home Front

WASHINGTON, April 14 (U.P.) An Office of War Information report said today that the problem of keeping women in the wartime labor force has become the "No. 1 manpower task of 1944."

The report said the "turnover rate among women had reached "alarming proportions," with large numbers quitting because of fatigue, a lack of community services, or general difficulties in running two jobs—at home and in war plants.

Many women left because they felt their war service had been exaggerated or that the war was about over, the report said.

The OWI, however, estimated that between 1,500,000 and 2,000,000 more women must be recruited by mid-summer for war jobs in industry, local activities, and on the farm to meet production
