Dear Dr. Edelman:

We have received from Dr. Kehoe in Cincinnati, a letter describing in considerable detail the results of his conversation with you on June 10th.

We are writing you at Dr. Kehoe's suggestion to inform you that it will be possible for us to furnish you with sufficient Tetraethyl Lead in cans containing approximately one liter each, to manufacture a batch of approximately 450 lbs. of the arsenious compound.

Our Manufacturing Department feels rather strongly that Tetraethyl Lead shipped for purposes such as these should be colored with an oil soluble dye in sufficient quantity to give the liquid a characteristic shade. We are not entirely sure whether the addition of a small quantity of dye would in any way interfere with the chemical reactions which you contemplate. If it would not, we would greatly appreciate your permission to add the color before shipping.

In the interest of safety and shipping convenience, we would also appreciate your ordering Tetraethyl Lead in units of 12 cans thus permitting us to use our standard case. It is suggested that every effort be made to preserve the original shipping container for use in returning empty cans, and that such empty cans be returned in units of 12 as rapidly as they become available.

Do not hesitate to call upon us for any further assistance which we can give.
