S. F. Police Board Opens Student Beating Inquiry

SAN FRANCISCO, March 11. (AP)—A Palo Alto physician described in clinical detail today the broken bones and bruises he treated for two Stanford University freshmen at the police commission hearing into charges against two officers who are accused of beating the boys.

Dr. F. F. Roth said Don Allan, 18, of Woodside, had a fractured nasal bone, a hemorrhage and swelling on the right shin, and an injured right rib. Carter Barber, 18, of Winnetka, Ill., had a swollen face, numbness across his upper teeth, a bruised knee and complained of pain in his breathing.

Policemen accused of inflicting the beatings without provocation in the southern police station early the morning of March 2 after the lads had been picked up as vagrants, are Joseph Francis Greene and John J. De-mond.

The San Francisco Bar association and the police committee of the county grand jury both had delegated observers at the proceedings.

Another witness, William Steff, 18, also a freshman at Stanford, told of bringing Allan and Barber to the waterfront in his car Saturday evening. He said Allan had let his beard grow and he understood the youths intended to roam through districts frequented by tramps and men down on their luck, to talk with them and get their point of view.

Before being ordained, Father Hardiman studied at St. Patrick's seminary at Menlo Park.

OYSTER STUFFED EGGPLANT

- 1 large eggplant
- 1 lb. can oysters, drained and chopped
- 1 cup cooked rice
- 1/2 cup chopped crisp bacon
- 1/4 cup cream or top milk
- 1 teaspoon seasoning salt
- 1 teaspoon A-1 sauce
- 1/2 cup chili sauce
- 2 slices uncooked bacon

Cut eggplant in half lengthwise and parboil for 15 minutes. Scoop out pulp to within 1/2 inch of skin. Chop pulp and combine with oysters, rice, bacon, cream, seasoning salt and A-1 sauce. Fill eggplant shell with the mixture. Top with chili sauce and slices of uncooked bacon. Bake in a hot oven (400°) for about 15 minutes. Serves 6.
