

DEFINITIONS

Industry SIC Code: The Standard Industrial Classification for the establishment

Recordable Case: All occupational deaths and illnesses and any occupational injury which involves one or more of the following: loss of consciousness; restriction of work or motion; transfer to another job; or medical treatment (other than first aid).

Lost Workday Case: Any occupational injury/illness which results in days away from work or days of restricted work activity.

Incident Rates:

Total Recordable Cases - represents the number of injuries and illnesses reported for each 100 full-time employees, and calculated as:

$(N/MI) \times 200,000$, where

N = Total Recordable Cases

MI = Total Man-hours Worked

200,000 = Base per 100 Employees (working 40 hours per week, 50 weeks per year).

Lost Workday Cases - represents the number of Lost Workday Cases per 100 employees, calculated as above, where (N) = Total Lost Workday Cases.

Days Away From Work - represents the number of workdays lost per 100 employees, calculated as above, where (N) = Total Days Away From Work.

Workers' Compensation 1992: Total cost of claims incurred, including administrative costs.

SIC Average Rates: As reported by the National Safety Council from data submitted by its members.
