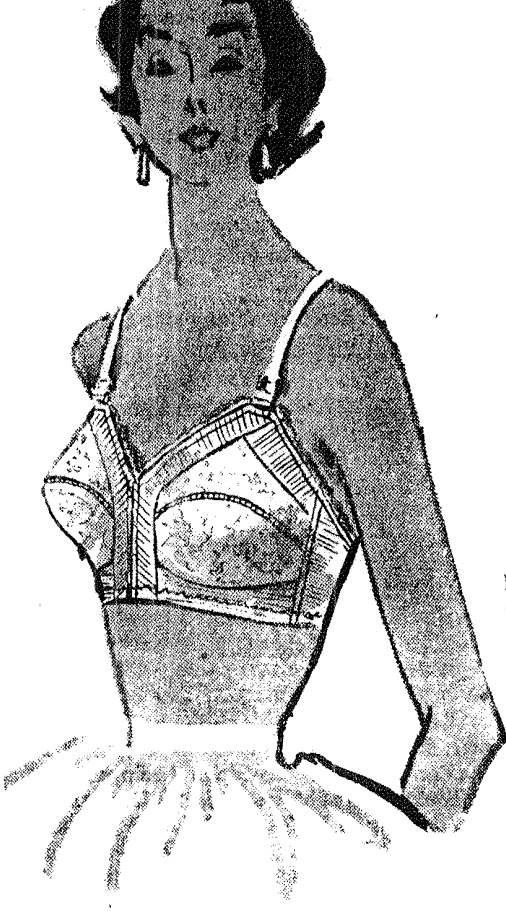

our midst have not been discouraged," he said. "The task confronting us today is to reverse the trend of recent years and recognize that our way of life will differ from that of the totalitarian world only so long as we do preserve our freedom to dissent."

In a talk on "Automation: The Second Industrial Revolution," Frank K. Shallenberger, professor of industrial management, Graduate School of Business, said that the trend toward automatic plants promises higher standards of living, lower costs, new products, greater material wealth and more leisure.

MORE JOBS CREATED.

Technology has always created more jobs than it has destroyed, he added.

William A. Spurr, professor of business statistics, Graduate School of Business, said that the possibility of a depression still remains, and that business executives must be ready to take immediate defensive action against the threat.

Depressions were headed off in 1945, 1949 and 1953, Spurr said.
