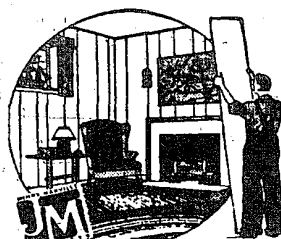
Mrs. Roosevelt Tells A Red Cross Story

SAN FRANCISCO, April 9 (P)
Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt, urg-

close to it," she related. "He

ahead of the front."
