Smith, account of Mary M. Smith's estate, and other records of a Baltimore firm engaged in the wholesale trade in drugs, paints, and oils, first run by Robert M. Smith and James E. Atkinson, then by Smith and Philip S. Chappell, and finally by Smith alone. Includes business records (1869-72) of R. M. Smith, collector of internal revenue.

Records from Allen's tenure as Vice President and member of the Board of Directors. Includes correspondence, subject reference files, minutes of meetings, and other documents. Subjects include employees relations, pigment research and production, and merger of Grasselli Chemical Company and the Krebs Pigment & Color Corporation with the du Pont Company.

Krebs was the founder in 1886 of the Delaware Chemical Co., which was consolidated with other firms in 1888 to become the National Ammonia Co., important in the manufacture of ammonia for use in the production of ice; also founder in 1901 of the Krebs Pigment & Chemical Co., Newport, Del., purchased by E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Co. in 1929. Collection consists of two scrapbooks relating to the production of lithopone and other chemical pigments, with related articles from European and American periodicals.

Pioneer West Coast firm manufacturing and selling paints, oil, and glass, founded by William P. Fuller as successor of Fuller & Heather of San Francisco and Sacramento, Calif., 1857-1868, and of Whittier, Fuller & Company of San Francisco, 1868-1894. - Letters sent to the company from its subsidiaries, Pioneer White Lead Works and Pioneer Color Works, and from branch officers in California and Portland, Or., primarily regarding orders for supplies and paints, reports, and other routine business matters.

Porter, G. Harvey, 1893-1978.

Papers, 1919-1977. - 22 boxes; ca. 500 items.

Executive officer of the Industrial Corporation of Baltimore, a firm specializing in financing, reorganization, and management counseling of small businesses and industry. - The collection consists of miscellaneous articles, speeches, and reports written or collected by Porter. The reports were prepared for over 200 companies, including rubber companies; metal companies; breweries; oil and stearic acid manufacturers; pottery and concrete companies; paper manufacturers; iron and steel companies; glass

manufacturers; paint manufacturers; food processing industries; plastics industries; canning companies; and enameling companies.

Correspondence, accounts, bills and receipts, stock books, formulae books (1844-1912), orders, shipping records, banking records, and other business records of a paint, varnish, and color manufacturing firm. Persons represented include Christian Schrack (ca. 1790-1854), founder of the firm, who began business as a carriage builder; his partner, Joseph Stulb (d. 1898); Stulb's sons, Edwin H. Stulb (1850-1920) and Joseph Stulb, Jr.; his grandsons, Joseph Reichert Stulb (b. 1883) and Edwin H. Stulb, Jr.; and Townsend Willits.
