CHEST: Flat plate of the chest shows considerable general peri-bronchial increase throughout the lower two thirds, the apices being relatively clear. Apparently a chronic infectious process non-tubercular in origin. There is evidence of early bronchiectasis. Suggest lipiodol for further information.

Aug 3 General appearance good, save for slight dyspnea. Patient is weak and has poor appetite. A. E. Canfield

Aug 4 General condition about the same. Dyspnea

8/6/44 Chronic interstitial pneumonia (asbestos)
Rheumatic valvular heart disease (mitral stenosis)
Auricular fibrillation

Good compensation - no obvious dyspnea at this time after rest. No edema at this time. B.P. 90/70.

Suggest continued rest: Digitalization with pulse rate is over 80. Coramine 1 cc. with 1% calcium phosphate q. 4 hr. for dyspnea. Diathermy through chest, both sides. 15 min. of chest - each day while in hospital.

8/10/44 Patient is doing very well. Dyspnea has been cleared up. And no complaints. A. E. Canfield

8/16/44 Patient's condition is very satisfactory, and he has no complaints. No dyspnea present. Patient is to be allowed to go home this or thereafter when ready. A. E. Canfield

8/9/44 May sit up in chair for awhile, afternoon and evening. *Regular diet.* *A.E. Canfield*

8/16/44 Patient may go home this noon. Is to return in weekly for a time for diathermy treatments. *A.E. Canfield*
