Probation Violator Ordered Returned

Arrested in Reno, Charles E. Perkins, 36, will be returned here tomorrow by Deputy Sheriff Clarence Snoddy Creel for violation of probation. Perkins' probation was revoked by Superior Judge Edward J. Tyrrell yesterday when it was revealed that he had set fire to grazing lands in Washoe County, Nevada. The court ordered Perkins on two years' probation on August 13 after he pleaded guilty to "willfully setting fire" to the dwelling where he lived at 5738 Avila Avenue. He also was directed to pay \$15 for the damage caused to the house. Sheriff H. P. California Bundists Face Citizenship Loss

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 15.—(U.P.)—Ten former members of the German-American Bund and the Silver Shirts are on Uncle Sam's "unwanted" list today as Federal Attorney John Marvin Dean disclosed that actions have been filed by the Government to revoke their citizenship.

Dean said the action had the approval of Attorney General Francis Biddle and the Justice Department, adding that similar suits will follow against members of other allegedly subversive groups.

Court Action Reveals Oaklander's Death

Death at sea of Enrique S. D. McKennie, Oaklander crew member of a merchantman, was revealed today in a prosaic Superior Court action.

His widow, Annie McKennie, 408 63rd Street, made the matter an official record when she petitioned the court to terminate her husband's interest in the residence property and make her the legal owner.
