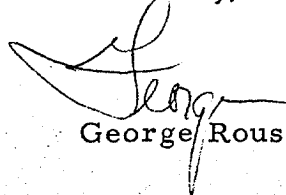
I would suggest that you send me a copy of the statement and I will see that you are reimbursed immediately.
