

entrance and exit purposes, benefiting to land within the assessment district, and benefits to the city as a whole.

It was decided that all land in the assessment district would benefit by stabilization of the district to avoid decentralization of business. It was estimated that business in the affected area would increase considerably as a result of providing adequate parking space and that this would result in increase in the land values. Therefore, a nominal rate per front foot was assessed on all land lying within the area.

Tax Roll Land

Since land adjoining the parking areas would benefit from easements, greater efficiency in fire protection, and in numerous other respects, a special benefit was assessed against adjoining properties.

The entire city was not assessed or the reason that it was considered use of the parking areas is a convenience to the general public, rather than a benefit. However, it was pointed out that the entire city will contribute because the land made into parking lots will be withdrawn from the tax rolls. This amounts to approximately \$600 a year.

Civil Liberties Group Aids Seditious

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 5. (AP)—The American Civil Liberties Union today filed a \$3,500 suit on behalf of Homer Glen Wilcox, director of Mankind United, against Lt. Gen. John L. DeWitt, former head of the western defense command; Lt. Gen. Delos Emmons, present commander, and other ranking army officers, alleging that Wilcox's rights were violated when military police removed him from his home to Las Vegas, Nev. Wilcox was one of several Mankind United leaders convicted recently of sedition and sentenced to five years in prison.

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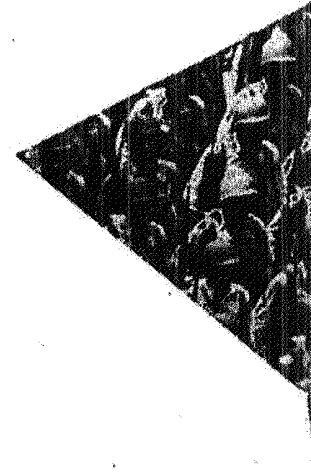
