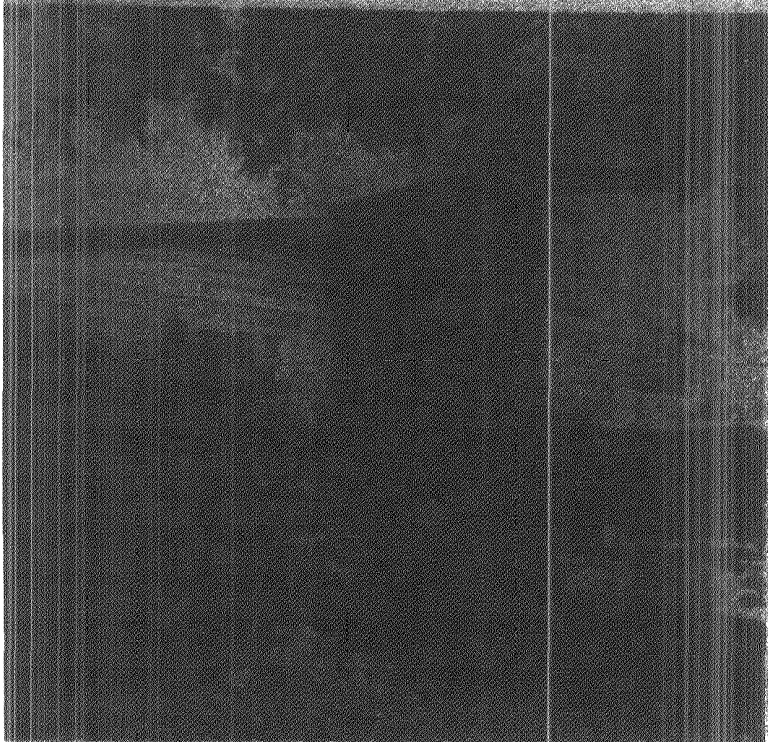




Taken from near the canyon bed, this shot shows exterior of Young home. Varied planting levels point out contour of site.

New Butterfat Test Simpler, Accurate

A new test for butterfat, simpler and more accurate than the old ones, has been worked out by scientists in the U.S. Bureau of Dairy Industry.

The new wrinkle is to use detergents and other chemicals instead of sulfuric acid. They do the job of separating the fat from the skim, so that it will rise to the neck of the bottle for a reading.

Testers will probably still have to use a centrifuge and graduated bottles to run the test. But scientists say that detergents make bottles easier to wash and eliminate the use of sulfuric acid which causes corrosion and is ticklish to handle.

They also make the test more accurate, because the fat column is clearer to read.

The new system has to be run through a few more refinements before it's put to general use around the country. It may be simplified even more before getting the final okay for on-the-farm tests.

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
