Dear Dr. Kehoe:

Mr. W. K. Holmes, superintendent of The Texas Company refinery, West Tulsa, called me about eleven o'clock last night to ask what remedy could be used in a case of lead poisoning and I asked for the particulars of the case. He stated that The Texas Company agent, Mr. Evert, at Concordia, Kansas, had just called him and stated that he had been advised that his sister living in Dodge City, Kansas, was suffering from a very severe case of lead poisoning due to having washed clothes in ETHYL Gasoline.

The information given Mr. Holmes was so meager that he could not give me any details regarding the woman's condition, particularly as to whether or not the evidence was of skin burning or pointed toward some internal condition. I advised Mr. Holmes that I had no right to suggest any remedies but pointed out to him that it was most unlikely that lead would be the cause of the difficulty and that it would seem to me that if she had skin burns it would be due to the gasoline and if the difficulty was a nauseous or respiratory nature it might be caused by gasoline fumes. We agreed that the best way to handle the matter would be for Mr. Holmes to give your address in Cincinnati to his agent and suggest that he pass it on to the doctors who are attending his sister so that they can get in touch with you if necessary.

I trust that this has been handled in accord with your desires.
