My dear Doctor Teegarden:

I am sending you herewith the results obtained on the samples of blood and urine of Mr. [REDACTED]. These results are well within the normal limits. They compare very well with results obtained consistently on young healthy experimental subjects selected on the basis of a completely negative history with respect to lead exposure. In as much as the blood and urinary findings are mutually confirmatory in that both are entirely normal I see no reason for making any further observations.

I should be interested in knowing how these results compare with those obtained elsewhere, and also how long ago the initial result of 0.11 mg. per liter, which you cited, was obtained. In any case, these results in my opinion exclude any possibility that this man is suffering from active toxic symptoms due to lead at this time. I shall be very much interested to hear of any further clinical developments in this case.
