FARMERS IN BAD WAY.

"The farmers of Japan today are worse off than they have ever been in the history of the country. The landowners are the chief losers. The tenant farmers lose when they have a poor crop but they do not lose as heavily as the owners of the land."

"Land values are too high. The farm owner makes less than 4 per cent on the average on his investment and at present, with poor crops, the landowners have been making less than that."

"The price of land is held up by artificial means. It is higher in Japan even than in America."

"Another reason why we cannot make money out of farming is that the Japanese farmers work with their hands and the most primitive of farm instruments. They cannot compete with farmers of the United States where machinery reduces the labor in farming and releases men to work elsewhere and produce more in other industries."

MUST HAVE FACTORIES.
"Japan must become a manufacturing nation. We have an abundant water supply. We must discontinue to export most of our raw silk and must manufacture our own silk cloth in Japan and export it in that form. That will give us a far greater revenue than the mere export of raw silk."

"The chief cause of the economic situation which is heading toward a disastrous panic, in Ozaki's opinion, is the artificial scale of living which the Japanese people have adopted. They demand luxuries which they cannot afford."
