The WOMAN'S BUREAU formulates standards to promote the welfare of women workers by compiling and analyzing statistics on women workers, developing labor legislation for women, promoting labor standards in the states, and publishing technical information

The BUREAU OF APPRENTICESHIP formulates and promotes labor standards for apprentices

The BUREAU OF EMPLOYMENT SECURITY, through the U S Employment Service, promotes and develops the nation's public employment offices and assists states on their unemployment insurance problems The Bureau also maintains a veterans' employment service

WAGE AND HOUR AND PUBLIC CONTRACTS DIVISION is charged with administering and enforcing the minimum wage and maximum hours regulations set up in the Fair Labor Standards and the Public Contracts Act The division administers the safety and health provisions of the Walsh-Healey Public Contracts Act under regulations promulgated by the Secretary of Labor

PRESIDENT'S CONFERENCE ON OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY This conference was first called by the President of the United States in March of 1949 Conferences have been held in 1950, 1952, 1954, 1956, 1958, 1960, and 1962 At the conferences have been representatives of management, labor, insurance

companies, educational institutions, and safety organizations The purpose of the conference is to foster a common effort to expand the use of safe practices and the establishment of safe conditions for employed persons Special attention is given to the needs of the smaller plant

The Federal Government's role in industrial safety, as recommended by the conference, is to

- 1 Make national comparative statistical studies
- 2 Provide technical information based on fact finding
- 3 Provide information, based on the above studies, to states and private organizations for the formulation of codes, regulations, and practices
- 4 Assist state agencies in improving administrative techniques so that codes and regulations which are adopted may be enforced
- 5 Advise states on enactment of proper legislation.
- 6 Train inspecting personnel of state agencies

Proceedings of the conference have been published by the Department of Labor and distributed to conference members Proceedings include detailed committee reports, major speeches, technical discussions, and summaries of conference recommendations and conclusions

STATE SAFETY CONFERENCES The President's Conference urged the various states to hold state conferences Each governor was requested to lead in getting all those interested into a common effort to reduce industrial accidents
